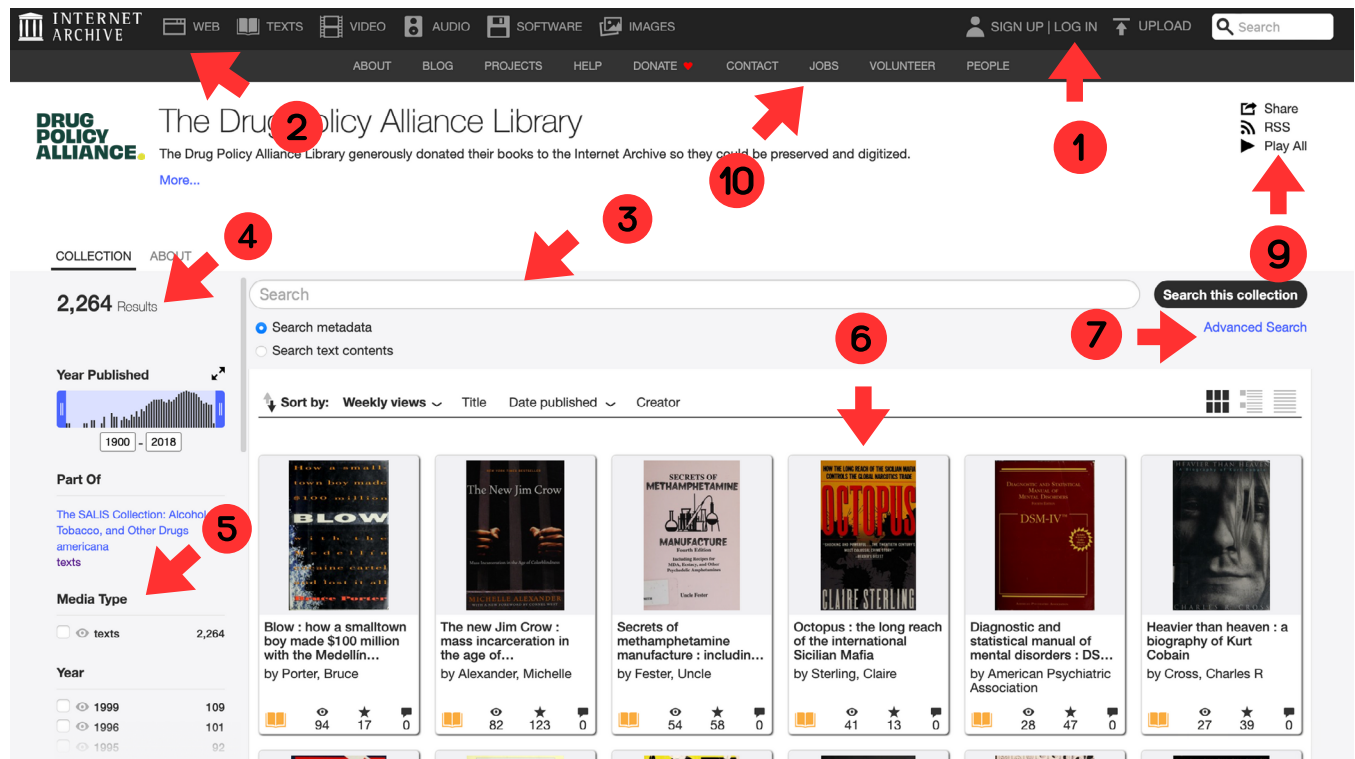


All of Drug Policy Alliance's books have been digitized as part of the Substance Use Librarians and Information Specialists (SALIS) collection in the Internet Archive's library for free access. Other content linked to the Internet Archive's library is also free for use! However, not all content is downloadable and depends on the specific media source. Creating an account isn't necessary but can be useful for keeping track of your requests, downloads, favorite media from the library, write reviews, or upload your own media to the library. 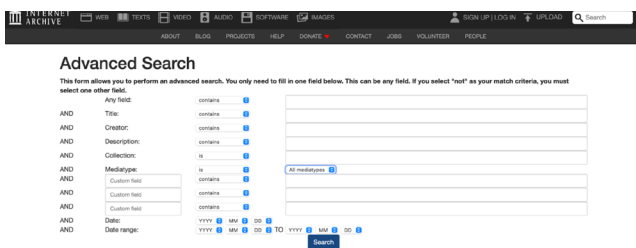
1. Create an account by logging in or signing up to keep track of your searches, favorite media, download items, and leave comments. While an account is not required for searching or downloading content, it offers useful features for managing your activity.
2. Select by media type, including web, text, video, audio, software, and images, which can be accessed from the top dashboard. Clicking on a media type allows users to further sort by specific libraries or categories.

- Start a quick search by author or title by simply entering the terms into the search bar. Reset your search by clicking "Search this collection" at any time.

When searching metadata, results are based on item details such as title, creator, description, and subjects.

Searching "text contents" allows you to explore the full text of books and other media.

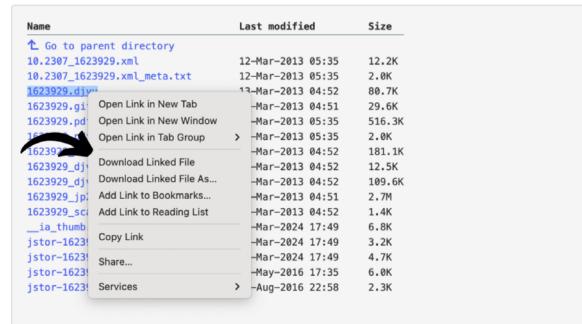
- The number of results from your specific search will be displayed. Adjust the publication date by a specific year or a range of years. This date range automatically updates with each new search or filter to reflect the relevant publication periods.
- Refine your search using filters on the left side of the page, such as media type, subject, collection, or language. Click the eye icon next to a category to exclude media related to that topic from your search.
- Browse through search results, where each media item shows its type, number of views, favorites, and comments.
- Use the advanced search option to include or exclude specific criteria. Fill in only one field, and if you select "not" as the match criteria, make sure to choose at least one other field.



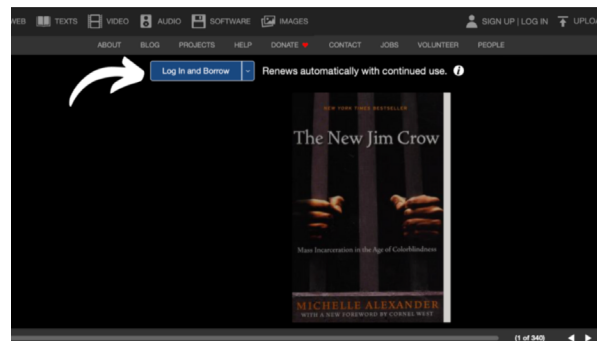
#### Advanced Search returning JSON, XML, and more

- Download content by clicking your search result, then select 'Show All Links' under the download options section. Right-click the file you want to download and click 'Download Linked File' for your desired file type (e.g., PDF, TXT). Once downloaded, the file is yours indefinitely.



Books are from the lending library, and you must log into your account to download them. If the book is already out on loan you will be invited to join a waiting list and you will be notified, via email, as soon as the book is available. They must be read within 14 days before they are automatically returned.



- Share content via social media or email, or use the Newsify RSS Reader for a smoother experience, especially when browsing multiple items at once. RSS is an app that allows users to receive website updates in a standardized format, making it ideal for staying updated on new content from multiple sites without needing to visit each one.
- Explore other non-DPA library content available through Internet Archive.
